

## **Stephen M. Cutler**

Stephen M. Cutler is Executive Vice President and General Counsel of JPMorgan Chase & Co., where he oversees the global financial services firm's Legal and Compliance Department. Previously, he was a partner and co-chair of the Securities Department at Wilmer Cutler Pickering Hale and Dorr, resident in the firm's Washington, D.C. office. From 2001 to 2005, Steve was the Director of Enforcement at the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission, and led the agency's investigations and cases involving, among others, Enron, WorldCom, mutual fund market timing, research analyst conflicts and specialist activity at the New York Stock Exchange. Before arriving at the SEC in 1999 as the Enforcement Division's Deputy Director, Steve spent 11 years at Wilmer, Cutler & Pickering, the last six as partner focusing on broker-dealer regulatory and enforcement issues. Steve received his B.A. summa cum laude from Yale University and his J.D. from Yale Law School, where he was an Editor of the Yale Law Journal. Immediately following law school, he spent a year clerking for Judge Dorothy W. Nelson on the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit and then a year as a Visiting Fellow at the Center for Law in the Public Interest in Los Angeles. Steve serves on the Boards of the SEC Historical Society, the Association of SEC Alumni, and the Appleseed Foundation. He is also a member of the Yale Law School Executive Committee.
