Eric S. Robinson joined Wachtell, Lipton, Rosen & Katz in 1983 and became a partner on January 1, 1990. Mr. Robinson received his B.A. from Harvard College in 1979 where he was a member of Phi Beta Kappa, a J.D. from Yale Law School in 1983 and an M.B.A. from Yale Management School in 1983. His practice focuses principally on mergers and acquisitions and securities law matters, including negotiated as well as hostile takeovers, spin-offs, proxy contests and initial public offerings. Mr. Robinson also advises public company boards of directors on takeover defense, audit committee, compliance and corporate governance matters.
