

## **JOHN ZUCKER**

John Zucker has devoted his legal career to advising, protecting, and representing journalists. He is currently Senior Vice President for Law & Regulation at ABC, Inc. Mr. Zucker's work with journalists at ABC News and the ABC owned television stations covers a wide range of legal issues including libel, invasion of privacy, access, FOIA, trespass, use of hidden camera and other surreptitious techniques, copyright, and protection of sources and journalistic materials. His work for ABC also includes Federal Communications Commission regulatory issues such as indecency and political equal time. Prior to joining ABC in 1993, Mr. Zucker was senior attorney at CBS Inc. and an associate at Wilmer, Cutler & Pickering in Washington, D.C. After graduating from Yale Law School in 1979, he clerked for Judge J. Joseph Smith on the 2d Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals and for Judge Jose A. Cabranes, then of the U.S. District Court of Connecticut. He graduated in 1976 from Yale College, where he was editor-in-chief of the Yale Daily News and a member of the Yale Russian Chorus. Since 1999 he has been an adjunct professor at the Columbia School of Journalism, where he teaches a seminar titled "Journalism, the Law, and Society." From 1987 to 1994 he was a visiting lecturer at Yale College, teaching a residential college seminar titled "The Media and the First Amendment." He is a member of the Board of Directors of the Yale Daily News' OCD Foundation.
